



November Prayer Letter

This past month has proven to be an eventful one. We celebrated both Katelynn's and Sydney's birthday this month. We have been in five different states and driven thousands of miles. We have met some amazing families, made new friends, and seen familiar faces as well. The month started off with our participation in our Home Church's Missions Conference. This was truly a bitter sweet experience. It was difficult to say good bye to this wonderful family of ours.

We have seen the Lord answer many prayers this past month. We have been able to schedule eleven meetings. We have had two Churches take us on for support (Mt Logan Baptist Church in Logan Utah and Macedonia Baptist Church in Colfax, WA). Both of these Churches have been a tremendous encouragement to us. We very narrowly escaped bad weather near Monida pass in south east Idaho. We drove through the night before a storm system moved in and dumped approximately two feet of snow on the pass. The pass was closed for several days, therefore, we would have likely missed several meetings had we not traveled when we did. We also encountered twenty-five mile an hour winds (with gusts much higher than that) in eastern Oregon. Normally that wouldn't be a big deal, however, when you are in a large RV that is quite a different story. Praying for safe travels has suddenly taken on a whole new meaning.

On the evening of the 26th our ten-year-old daughter Sydney came to Christy and I and was acting funny. She suddenly sat down and became unresponsive. The left-hand side of her body was almost entirely paralyzed. After quickly driving her to the emergency room in the neighboring town they ran a CT scan and conducted an EKG. Both tests were somewhat inconclusive. We are scheduled for her to have an MRI and an EEG this coming Monday. We have been staying with J.R. Thompson and his wife Hannah during this time. We are thankful for this for so many reasons but one of which, Hannah being a nurse was able to help us through this trial in an extra special way. These two have been a blessing to us. We're not sure if Sydney had a stroke or a seizure but we hope the further testing will clarify that for us.




We have also been able to test out our RV in cold weather. This morning it was 6° outside. So far so good. The heaters are working well and as far as I know we don't have any frozen pipes.

Thank you so very much for all of you who pray for us. That is the greatest thing that any one of you can do. This season of our life is uniquely challenging and it is greatly encouraging to know that you all are praying for us.
